

# **2008 CAANCB/ACANBC AWARDS**

## **CALL FOR NOMINATIONS**

The Canadian Association for Anatomy, Neurobiology and Cell Biology Awards Committee is requesting nominations for the award categories listed below. Please note that for these awards either the nominator **or** the nominee must be a member of the CAANCB. The awards will be announced at the Annual Awards Banquet of the Association in **Winnipeg, in June, 2008**. For the **JCB Grant, ML Barr, and AW Hamm Awards**, four copies of the application (includes letter of nomination, applicants current CV, and any attachments) are required. **Alternatively**, applications may be submitted entirely by e-mail (i.e., electronic format, Adobe PDF preferred) and must be **received by Friday, April 11, 2008**. **Send to:** Dr. Hugo T. ### **Guidelines for the various awards are as follows:**

**J.C.B. GRANT AWARD** - Presented to an outstanding senior scientist, who is a full professor, in recognition of special merit and achievement in research and teaching in the field of anatomy, neurobiology or cell biology. The recipient should have contributed significantly to science in Canada, and be recognized internationally as a leading scientist. Nominations for this award shall be allowed to stand for 3 consecutive years. This award is sponsored by Lippincott, Williams & Wilkins Publishers, Baltimore, Maryland.

**MURRAY L. BARR YOUNG INVESTIGATOR AWARD** - Presented to an outstanding young scientist in recognition of special merit and achievement in the field of anatomy, neurobiology or cell biology. The recipient must be an assistant or associate professor in anatomy with no more than ten years of active employment, after appointment at the assistant professor level, at an academic institution. Nominations for this award shall be allowed to stand for 2 consecutive years. This award is sponsored jointly by Lippincott, Williams & Wilkins Publishers and the Murray Barr Memorial Trust Fund.

**ARTHUR W. HAM GRADUATE STUDENT AWARD** - Presented to a Ph.D. student who is an outstanding student in the field of anatomy, neurobiology or cell biology as indicated by scholarships, fellowships, awards, etc. The recipient should be the senior author or contributor of at least 2 publications (excluding abstracts), and have made at least two presentations at scientific meetings. Students who have recently graduated or are expecting to graduate in the current calendar year are eligible. This award is sponsored jointly by Lippincott Williams & Wilkins and the CAANCB/ACANBC Chairs.

**RESEARCH PUBLICATION AWARD OF THE CAANCB/ACANBC CHAIRS** - This award is valued at \$250 and is presented to a graduate student who is either sole author or senior author of an article judged to be the most outstanding publication of original research in the field of anatomy, neurobiology or cell biology within the past year. The application consists of a nominating letter(s) and a copy/reprint of the publication.

**C.P. LEBLOND RESEARCH PRESENTATION AWARDS** - Two awards are given to the graduate students (1 Ph.D., 1 M.Sc.) that present the best oral platform presentation at the annual meeting. **Students interested in competing for this award should indicate their intent at the time of online submission of their abstract through the CFBS website.** These awards are valued at \$400 each and are sponsored by the CAANCB/ACANBC Chairs.

**TRAVEL AWARDS** - Two travel awards are available to help graduate students in anatomy, neurobiology and cell biology defray travel expenses to attend the CFBS meeting. Students interested in competing for the awards should forward their meeting abstract, along with a cover letter, and their CV to the Chair of the Awards Committee. These awards are valued at \$400 each and are sponsored by the CAANCB/ACANBC Chairs.
